SUGGESTIONS

Clear Sailing is a metaphor for that lightness of spirit comes with the unfrilling of a sail. Just about any softly summer-colored linen will work nicely for the design except white or very pale colors. Some of the design will be lost against these linen colors. My favorite is Wichelt's 28 count "Star Sapphire" linen (761 13L) worked over two threads using two ply floss.

135W X 70H

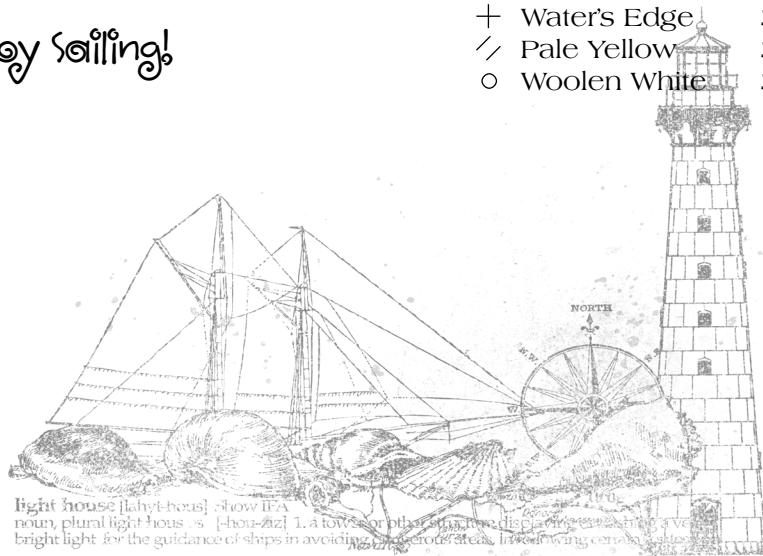
14 count (28 linen)..... 9.6 X 5
 15 count (30 linen)..... 9 X 4.7
 16 count (32 linen)..... 8.4 X 4.4
 Linen worked over two threads.

PLEASE place the center of the design using the centering arrows. The design is offset on the right to allow sailing room for the little boat.
